- For potted plants remove all faded blossoms, dried or damaged leaves. Foliage should be clean, with a natural sheen and all pots be scrubbed clean. The pots should be in good proportion to the plants.

- Exhibits stressing features, which detract from the commercial value of any produce, are undesirable and should be avoided. Any frozen fruit or vegetables will be disqualified.
- Unless otherwise specified, the type of vegetables desired for exhibit, will be a uniform commercial grade rather than overgrown. Monstrosities will not be considered for premium awards.

<u>Section 42512 – Mature</u> – having reached that stage of ripeness which will insure the completion of the ripening process to a degree which will insure palatability after the removal of the product from the tree, plant or vine.

<u>Section 42515 – Overripe</u> – having an advanced state of maturity which causes the product to be undesirable for human consumption in a fresh state.
